The raindrops falling on my jacket sounds like it used to sound on the tin roof of my grandpa's house. I like the soft spray of a foggy day wrapping me up in its mystery. Yep, this was a good day to walk. They all are. I'll be walking across South Dakota in September. I'd appreciate your prayers. I'm older, my knees are older, the walk goes slower, but, by God's grace it's gonna go.





I was born into an amazing family. My parents and grandparents all loved the Lord. They taught us the importance of trusting and following Jesus. I was raised in the church surrounded by good godly people. I believed in God. I knew he was real. But I didn't really know Him.

After graduating high school, I became addicted to opiates.

You don't realize it's happened until it's too late and then it completely consumes you. You forget who you are, who you were, who God created you to be. Your parents have told you your whole life that God has a plan for you, but how could this be a part of the plan? Something that I asked myself so many times.

The drugs took everything that was good in my life and replaced it with chaotic hopelessness. Separated from my family, I found myself living on the streets in Sacramento. I wasn't alone. I had friends. We had campy community under and around the freeway. It wasn't

all bad but it wasn't living. My entire existence was built around feeding my flesh and I hated it. I knew there had to be more, but I didn't know how to change. I couldn't do it on my own. I tried. Rehabs, meetings, programs they never stuck.

Even though I had all but truly given up on myself. God said, "No, I'm not done with you yet, and yes this is part of my plan."

Through a series of the most incredible circumstances, which I won't try to get into because I could literally write a book about it. I came to the end of myself, truly cried out to God and he delivered me.

He delivered from an impossible situation, He delivered me from my addiction, and he brought me back home to my family after 5 years, just in time for Christmas! I have experienced miracles of healing and deliverance.

I have surrendered my life completely into God's hands and I'm never going back. I know who God is now. His Spirit lives inside of me. And I'm so grateful.

But in my mind I planned on buying her a tape measure. I forgot. Then today I opened this box that came in the mail, and right on the top lay a tape measure. A good one too, with a note that said my rambling words on Mueller had prompted their gift. It's only a coincidence when you miss God's wink. The Apostle Paul once wrote, "And may you have the power to understand, as all God's people should, how wide, how long, and how deep His love is".(Ephesians 3:18) God gave me the power to glance a token of His love for me today...and a tape measure to start ciphering It. ITEMS NEEDED

- 1. WAREHOUSE SPACE: Sometimes we get a lot of things we need, but we don't have a space for it right now. If we had some local warehouse space (within 30-40 miles), we could save now and plan for the future.
- 2. VEHICLES: We had two vehicles donated this past month. We had 5 graduate. And we always seem to need a dependable vehicle at His Place and Hosanna Home to get a resident to a doctor's appointment, home visit, to work, GED classes, to see the dentist, to go to court or even to go to a funeral...to do life! It takes a dependable vehicle to get ministry done with 51 men and 17 ladies (w/ 4 children).
- 3. CLEANING SUPPLIES, LAUNDRY SOAP and TOILETRIES (men's and women's). You can drop your items off at our office at Harvest Thrift Store or order them off of our *His Place* and *Hosanna Home Amazon Gift Registry* and have them sent directly to our homes. (Go to your Amazon and on "Gift Registry" look for His Place or Hosanna Home Gift Registry and click on the list. You'll see our most recent and 'always needed' needs lists)
- 4. This need is not an item, but rather a person(s). We need people who will donate of their time and talent to help serve our His Place men and Hosanna Home ladies. We could use a barber (and hairdresser for the ladies); a chiropractor, sometimes a doctor, always a dentist, drivers, an optometrist, counselor... most anyone willing to donate a little time and talent. Remember that your financial donation is what makes it possible to continue to run the ministries of Harvest Evangelism.

It is not easy for any of us to ask for the finances necessary to maintain the upkeep of our buildings, for utilities, meals, vehicles, insurance, staff, resident care, emergencies, etc... but we have to raise all the monies needed to keep this ministry going.

This is not an "emergency" plea, just an acknowledgment that all we do takes financial help. None of us work outside of Harvest Evangelism. We give our daily lives for the work that goes on here.
